
how it works

Melt is an open access festival, sometimes known as a fringe festival. Artists, companies, producers and community groups register their events online to participate. Venues also register their participation via the online portal.

Venues and artists/producers have three options to connect with one another. You can connect with each other either through Eventotron, in the real world, or the Melt team can assist by facilitating introductions between artists and venues. The deal is created and agreed upon between artists and venues directly. Melt can provide advice as well as useful templates such a draft agreement for venues and artists/producers to follow.

Melt welcomes events, performances and exhibitions that appeal to LGBTQIA+SB audiences. LGBTQIA+SB participants are encouraged to register, and allies invited to participate.

LGBTQIA+SB community events and activities are also encouraged to become part of the Melt program.

Step 4 – Click on 'Create a new venue' and complete details about your venue, then click on 'Join a festival' and select 'Melt'

Step 5 – Now you're registered! *
